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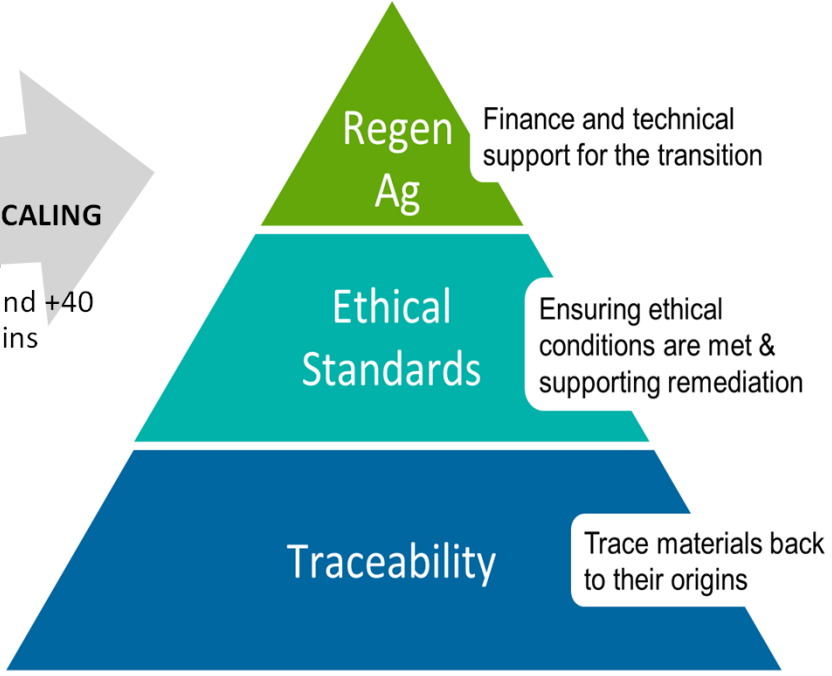
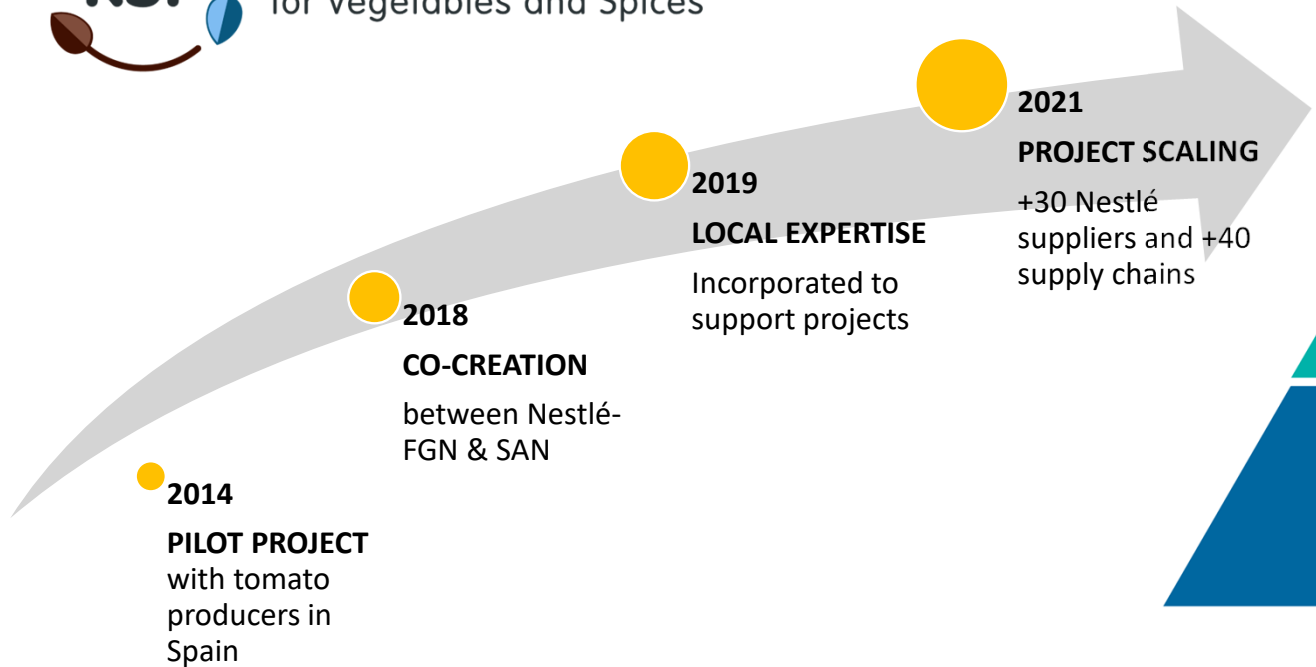

Including a total of 6,500 ha of agricultural land benefitted (4,300 ha of cover crops; 120 ha of flower strips; 28 ha of hedgerows and afforested areas; 20 ha of restored water habitats; +150 birds & bat boxes and beehives)
